Neighborhood Fyl: Trash Collection, Contributed by Susanne Mc Neely

Weekly collection: Most household waste can be put into the 96 gallon containers so long as it's bagged or bundled. Bagging reduces the amount of trash litter spilt during collection. <u>But</u> <u>don't</u> put in paint cans, motor oil, bulky metal things like tire rims or engines. (Tires without rims are okay.)

Heavy Trash Collection: Heavy trash is collected monthly. Each household is allowed 2 heavy trash items a month. They can included tree limbs and brush tied in bundles no larger than 3ft by 3ft. Also furniture and mattresses. Also appliances like stoves and water heaters. (Because of freon gas, pick up of refrigerators must be scheduled by calling the Mayors Action Center.) Tires with rims can be put out as heavy trash. Construction debris and building materials are **not** collected by the city.

ToxDrop: You can drop off items like paint cans, motor oil and chemicals.

e-Cycling: This program refers to recycling of electronics like computers and cell phones. These items contain heavy metals that need to stay out of landfills and ground water.

Recycling: The city contracts out the collection of recycling. Currently Republic serves Emerson Heights. They deliver a 96 gallon container to you and collect every other week. This program costs about \$8.25 a month and is billed directly by Republic every three months.

Linwood, **Drexel**, and **Bosart**: Regular pick-up on Thursdays. Heavy pick up on 2nd Thursday.

Carlisle, Wallace, Dequincy, Riley, Bancroft and Emerson: Regular pick-up on Mondays. Heavy pick-up on 4th Monday.

<u>Call the Mayor's Action Center at 317-327-6244</u> to schedule refrigerator pick up, arrange recycling service, or with questions. For more information about trash collection or ToxDrop sites see www.indy.gov under the Department of Public Works.
