Near Eastside Quality of Life Planning

In 2006, over 400 residents attended a community-wide visioning event that evolved into a plan complete with goals, action items and benchmarks. This plan is used by the city, funders, developers and the community as a guide to what the residents want in their neighborhoods. With many of those goals achieved, it's time to update the plan to include the visions of today.

On Saturday, September 7, another Community-wide Visioning Day was held. Hundreds of residents, including from Emerson Heights, discussed what they love about their neighborhoods and what they want to see them become. Goals and priorities were established.

On October 1st, at the first planning session neighbors came together to get deeper into each of the goals: Education; Economic and Workforce Development; Safety and Infrastructure; Arts, Culture, and Green Spaces; Health, Wellness and Family Strengthening; Equity and Engagement; and, Housing.

The next planning session is Tuesday, November 5 at 6 pm, at the Englewood Christian Church, 57 N. Rural Street.
