Our May Meeting was attended by representatives from DPW and Citizens Energy Group.

Michigan Street Two-Way Conversion Project Update

Planners working on the Department of Public Works (DPW) attended the meeting and presented information on the project's progress and answered questions. The project is still planned to be finished before the end of the year (weather permitting). This \$20 million initiative, spanning from College Avenue to Ellenberger Park, aims to reduce traffic speeds, enhance safety, and improve visibility for local businesses, creating a more neighborly and accessible environment.

The project includes comprehensive improvements such as sidewalk enhancements, curb and ADA ramp upgrades, crosswalk improvements, street resurfacing, protected bike lanes, and enhanced bus platforms.

Lead Line Replacement Program

In collaboration with the two way conversion project, Citizens Energy Group is taking the opportunity to replacing lead service lines to improve water quality and health. This work is being conducted first to streamline the overall construction process and reduce disruptions. The city owns the main infrastructure, while customers own the service lines. To replace the lines with without the need for extensive digging, lines are being pulled through existing pipes. New meters will be installed in some cases. Additional funding to replace more lines in the future is being sought. Residents will receive notifications via email, text, and door-to-door communication if work is planned near their properties.

Neighborhood Pride and Placemaking Projects

Planning Home Improvement Projects? Residents in Emerson Heights are eligible for the Indiana Residential Historic Rehabilitation Credit

A tax credit is available to encourage the maintenance of the historic nature of the community. This credit is for Indiana state income taxpayers who undertake certified rehabilitations of historic buildings that are principally used and occupied by the taxpayer as the primary residence. The credit allows for up to 20% of total qualified rehabilitation or preservation cost. The minimum expenditures are \$10,000.
